2017 NSW Crackerjack & Dynamites



What is a Crackerjack and Dynamite?

• A Crackerjack is a rider aged 8 & 9. A Dynamite is a rider aged 10, 11 & 12.

What do we do in NSW?

- The relevant age classes are automatically scored for the CJ & DM Teams at our State Series rounds. The same rules apply as for State Series qualification ie you must ride 4 of 6 events on offer and 1 of the 4 must be a country round.
- All ages are included in the State Series pointscore in addition to CJ and DM scoring
- The top 3 qualifiers from each age class are awarded a CJ or DM team jersey at the State Titles Annual Awards Dinner that will be worn at the National Championships when representing our State the following year.
- If a qualified rider is not competing at Nationals the next qualified rider can receive the jersey.
- The State provides free coaching at each State Series round for all qualified riders. A Teamer notification is sent out prior to each State Series round to qualified riders. The current year Teams attend the coaching up until Nationals. After Nationals the top 3 riders from each age are invited to attend the free coaching.

2017 Nationals Format has Changed! 📇



- •CJ & DM will not compete on a separate day or have their own event.
- •Scores for each team rider will be taken from their 20" class event.
- Team riders are encouraged to wear their State jersey
- BMXA require the winners to attend the Awards Dinner

International focus: ideas



- Option 1 Training Camp in Japan
 - 4 riders & 1 Coach
 - Attend a training camp and race event
 - Funded by Parents
 - Sponsored by BMXNSW
- Option 2 Test Team event with Japan for next age bracket
 - Will be based on the same Test Team structure we use today with NZ
 - 4 male and 4 female riders
- Option 3 a 4 country competition for next age bracket
 - Most favoured option
 - Australia, Japan, country 3 and country 4
 - Working with Martin & Masa Sampei from Japan currently
 - 2 male and 2 female riders from each country
 - Will be based on the same Test Team structure we use today with NZ
 - First event to be run in Australia

2016 BMXNSW FINANCE REPORT CARD



- The State remains in a strong financial position
- Professional bookkeeping services and independent annual auditors are employed
- Changes to the physical payments of the Pro Prize money
- First Aid
 - Rider levy increases
 - Cash flow negative
- Total income increased by 2.85% (\$253,606 V \$246,570)
- Total expenses increased by 11.27% (\$257,127 V \$231,094)



Organisations You Need To Know











Racing



- Masterclass
 - 30+ riders
 - Masterclass riders can also ride Age and Cruiser (same as Superclass riders)
 - Entry fee is \$5 extra per rider
 - Awards, double for podium and as per Age for 4-8
 - Open events only (2017 State Titles is under consideration)
- Pro-section
 - Mandatory for male Superclass riders
 - Optional for female Superclass riders

First Aid



- Cost more in 2016 than 2015 but well worth the investment
- Two providers for 2017
 - Emergency Medics Australia
 - Acute Medical
- Approx 6 first aiders for racing (depending on the track)
- First aider on the finish line
- There will always be BMX experienced first aiders (BMXperts) in attendance
- Concussion

Racing: Entries / Transponders



- Late Entry
 - From the Bathurst event onwards
 - 24 hour period 00:00 to 23:59 Monday
 - Online entries only
 - \$20 per rider
- Transponder
 - Riders responsibility
 - No start pick-up = DNF
 - No finish pick-up (commissaire best efforts)

Racing: BMXNSW Trailer



- Trailer
 - BMXNSW trailer
 - BMXNSW logo
 - Scoreshed equipment, transportation to different events (logistics)
 - First Aid tents (save on first aid costs)
 - State team support for Shepparton, Bathurst events etc (tents, eskys etc)

Racing: Registration / sign-on



- Registration / sign-on
 - The registration / sign-on process will no longer be necessary from the Bathurst open event onwards
 - Online entry will cover entry and registration
 - Riders will check their entry with the transponder checking station
 - Sprocket's parents / guardians will check a sheet posted on the board
 - Racing is locked down at 09:00, no changes after this time (number plate etc)
 - If riders cannot attend the race they need to sent a text to the scoreshed by 09:00, failure to do this impacts the race and your peers

Macarthur Club



- 1. Race Format: Deadman rules
- 2. Addition of Mini wheelers

Deadman rules



- It's necessary for the younger girls to push them to ride and train otherwise what incentive to race just roll around and you'll get something
- It's fair between gender an 8-year-boy has to work hard to get into the final, so why should not a girl?
- It gives value to making the main, which is a big thing for a lot of kids in the sport.
- There are arguments about other States running no deadman finals, that does not mean it is the best way to do things, both rules are in the rulebook
- The real issue is that there are not enough riders in the class, the conversation becomes irrelevant once there are 9 riders in a class.
- So focus needs to be on attracting more riders than rather trying to change the rule every year.

Mini wheelers

- There is a pathway through BMX from non-riders to Proriders
- Each step provides encouragement for riders to progress
- Mini wheelers is the first step on that pathway it is an entry level class
- Mini wheelers are small children who cannot ride bikes, typically 2, 3 or 4 years old.
- They have no concept of State series or State run open race, so from a rider perspective there is no value
- The reward for being able to ride a BMX bike is the opportunity to race in State run events across NSW

Hawkesbury BMX Club



- Currently any knee/shin or elbow pad that does not feature a hard shell is not able to be worn by a rider as their outer layer. Refer Rule 043, BMXA Rulebook.
- This discourages riders from utilising the latest technology in energy absorption that is being utilised in protective equipment by companies such as G Form, Troy Lee Designs, POC and ION

• Request submission from BMX NSW to BMX Australia for amendment to rule 043. The term "Rigid Surface" to be removed.
